### Who Are We?

### Reserve Growth Initiative

- ♦ CMEA wants to represent all Engineers
- ♦ Approx 110 Reserve members; this is less than 5%
- Challenges:
  - Our programs do not necessarily benefit reserves
  - Seen to be in competition with Unit Associations
- ♦ Two options were put forward to the Reserves:
  - Each Reserve unit becomes a chapter at no cost; but individuals must join CMEA to access personal benefits;
  - For a flat rate each Reserve unit becomes a chapter AND every unit member becomes a full CMEA mbr enjoying full benefits.
- ♦ No Consensus; 3 (+) units interested in option 2
- Plan to proceed with those units as trial.

- ♦ We are serving the needs of the CME family
- We are getting leadership from across the CME Branch: officers and NCMs, serving and retired
- We are providing leadership to other associations (Log, Int, Sigs, Gunners)
