Reserve Growth Initiative

- ♦ CMEA wants to represent all Engineers
- ♦ Approx 110 Reserve members; this is less than 5%
- Challenges:
 - Our programs do not necessarily benefit reserves
 - Seen to be in competition with Unit Associations
- ♦ Two options were put forward to the Reserves:
 - Each Reserve unit becomes a chapter at no cost; but individuals must join CMEA to access personal benefits;
 - For a flat rate each Reserve unit becomes a chapter AND every unit member becomes a full CMEA mbr enjoying full benefits.
- ♦ No Consensus; 3 (+) units interested in option 2
- Plan to proceed with those units as trial.

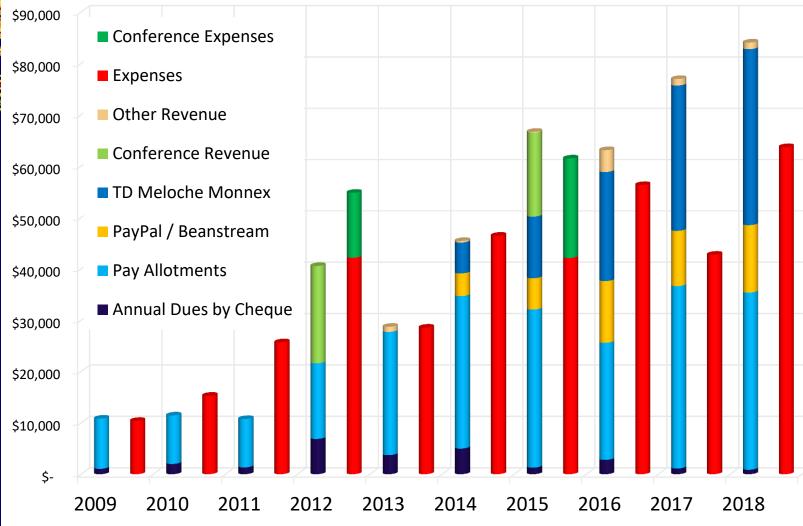


Revenue

- ♦ Dues are only \$24.00 per year
 - ◆ Majority of serving members pay through pay allotments (approx. 1600)
 - ◆ Payment via other means (Approx 700)
 - ♦ Approx 500 online
 - ◆ Approx 200 by cash/cheque Registrar or through local chapter
- Non-dues revenue through affinity programs

<u>Note:</u> **2012** was a pivotal year - covers period of Oct 2011 to Dec 2012 (change fiscal year); doubled scholarships from 3 to 6x\$1000 beginning in 2011; held CMEA Conference Nov 2012; started CMEA website redesign; and focussed on CMEA membership growth

Affinity Programs

- ♦ TD Insurance Meloche Monnex most successful YTD
 - 20%+ sustained growth in mbr participation, policies & rtns
 - 2018 contribution: \$34,289
 - Total contributions since program inception exceed \$100,000
- Street Capital Bank program terminated
 - replaced by Mortgage Alliance Main Street Mortgages
- Workopolis Niche Network Job Board terminated
 - replaced by Madgex Career Centre
- Travel discounts for hotel and auto rentals continues with Local Hospitality Inc.
- ♦ New affinity program with **Perkopolis** to provide low cost electronics, clothing, resorts, entertainment, etc.
- New advertisers supporting the CMEA News Brief, but will need to be sustained.



2018 Bursaries

- ◆ This year bursaries were increased from \$1,000 to \$1500 and included a new category for reserves. A total of \$12,000 in \$1,500 bursaries were awarded to 8 deserving applicants:

- In the past decade, 56 bursaries, with a total value of \$60,000, have been awarded to CMEA members & dependents.

Engineers in Need

- In 2018 there were 8 requests for support for a total of \$2050 from National and \$1400 from local chapters.
- This amount does not include amounts that local chapters may have donated and did not request or inform the CME CWO
- ◆ Since its inception in 2013, \$13,500 in Association national funds have been devoted to helping Engineers in Need, almost all of it matched by the sponsoring chapters.



OP Sapper Claus

- Christmas gift packages sent to Engineers on deployment overseas or serving in the far north
- Fifth year in operation:
 - 2014 56 packages sent
 - − 2015 − 95 packages sent
 - − 2016 − 73 packages sent
 - − 2017 − 145 packages sent
 - 2018 160 packages sent
- ◆ Since inception, a total of 529 gift packages have been sent, for a cost of approx. \$7,500

Other Support to CME Family

- CMEA Commendation:
 - MWO Lori Anne Kelly, 9 Wing Gander, for outstanding work in establishing the first CMEA Chapter in Quebec at Bagotville.
 - Presentation by CO 9 Wing (date TBD)
- Reservist job protection:
 - In co-operation with CDA and other branch/corps associations, supported RCAA request to MND for improvements to federal job protection for reservists, as well as harmonization between federal and provincial legislation.



National Conference 2018

- ◆ 28-29 November 2018 at the Ottawa Army Officers Mess (AOM).
 - ◆ Theme: *Strong, Secure, Engaged* The Impact of Canada's 2017 Defence Policy on Military Engineers
 - ♦ Two day format:
 - ◆ Day 1: General Interest to CME members and sponsors
 - ♦ Followed by informal meet and greet
 - ♦ Day 2: Association General Meeting.
 - ◆ Followed by CME fall mess dinner
- Over 80 registered participants
- ◆ 11+ chapters represented (vs 3 in 2015)



The Way Ahead: 2015-2018

- **Growth**: Expand CMEA activities to more fully represent and serve the CME family:
 - A chapter wherever there is an engineer unit
 - Double the number of members (associates)
 - Create new programs to assist and attract members
- Unity and Esprit: Improve unity and esprit de corps across the CME family:
 - Improve recognition of individual and group achievement
 - Promote the history, heritage and customs of the CME Branch
 - Build CMEA into a unifying force
 - Achieve broader chapter participation in national governance
- Management: Improve CMEA governance, transparency, awareness, and interaction with members:
 - Enhance Communications
 - Improve association management
 - Develop coherent membership policies
