- Leaving a will
- Naming beneficiaries in insurance and other policies,
- Planning and prepaying for your funeral,
- Using life insurance to cover expenses,
- Giving gifts before your death,
- Using your RRSP contributions as you wish,
- Buying permanent life insurance as an investment,
- Transferring property to joint ownership,
- Setting up trust fund(s), and
- Making arrangements in case of incapacity.
